COVID-19 Negative Certificate must meet the following requirements.

Exemption	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Under 5 years old • A person or any person in a class of persons who, as determined by the Chief Public Health Officer, will provide an essential service, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by the Chief Public Health Officer to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19 • A person who is permitted to work in Canada as a provider of emergency services under paragraph 186(t) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations and who enters Canada for the purpose of providing those services • An emergency service provider, including a firefighter, peace officer, or paramedic, who returns to Canada after providing emergency services in a foreign country and who is required to provide their services within the 14-day period beginning on the day on which they return Canada • A person or any person in a class of persons whose presence in Canada, as determined by the Minister of Health, is in the national interest, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by that Minister to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19 • An official of the Government of Canada or a foreign government, including a border services officer, immigration enforcement officer, law enforcement officer, or correctional officer, who is escorting individuals travelling to Canada or from Canada pursuant to a legal process such as the deportation, extradition or international transfer of an offender • An official of the Government of Canada, the government of a province or a foreign government, including a border services officer, immigration enforcement officer, or law enforcement officer, who; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - enters Canada for the purposes of border, immigration or law enforcement, or national security activities, that support active investigations, ensure the continuity of enforcement operations or activities, or enable the transfer of information or evidence pursuant to or in support of a legal process; and - is required to provide their services within the 14-day period that begins on the day on which they enter Canada • Passengers connecting to an international flight without entering Canada • Passengers aged 5 to 11 years old who are not vaccinated or partially vaccinated traveling with fully vaccinated adults
Others	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the flight is delay due to circumstances not attributable to the passenger, if the delay is less than 24 hours, the test certificate is valid for up to 96 hours (72 hours + 24 hours) and there is no need to re-obtain a negative test certificate • When transit from international flight to domestic flight at Vancouver, If they have a certificate that meets the entry requirements for Vancouver, it is possible to exceed 72 hours before departure for domestic flights • Tests must be conducted outside of Canada. Test results tested in Canada not be accepted, even if the specimen collection date and time are met. • Self-contained is not acceptable.
